
Bay Head's First School

The museum is in possession of historic records that were gifted to the Bay Head Historical Society on March 12, 2002 by the Bay Head School Board of Education. These records of the early days of the Bay Head School include deeds, letters, bills, book orders, insurance records, etc. and two Bay Head Board of Education ledgers, one dating from March 20, 1900 to February 13, 1919 and the second from April 7, 1919 to February 9, 1921. These records piqued our interest. **When was the original school built and where was it located?**

In 1888 we see two entries in the Borough of Bayhead Council minutes. February 11, 1888 Dr. D.H. Mount would go the County Superintendent in Toms River "to intercede on behalf of the Borough to have certain portions of this neighborhood as a separate school district". On February 18, 1888, a new school district shall be named Bay Head School District and shall include all of Bay Head and Lovelandtown.

Of particular interest is a deed, dated May 17, 1888, recording a contract between the Bayhead Land Company and The Trustees of School District – Number Fifty- one, in the County of Ocean in the State of New Jersey...for the sum of Twenty dollars to purchase property for construction of a school house. The lot measuring 75' x 159.50' was at the location of the current Bay Head Reading Room.

Additional information was found in a publication named Chikaree in the Wall, a History of One-room Schools in Ocean



County, published by the Ocean County Historical Society, 1987, provided the following information: Bay Head School, Dates 1889 to 1912 when it became a two-room school house. It was located on the northeast corner of Meadow and Bay Avenues. (Bay Ave. was later terminated at Grove and renamed Holly). On February 23, 1911 it was recommended that a vote be taken on building an addition to the

school house. By July, the school Board was making plans for a 22' X 30' addition which conforms to State Board of Education requirements. The original building with the addition continued to serve as the Bay Head School until 1931 when a new school was built on the current property. The school has operated successfully for almost 130 years!

We appreciated the help from Ocean County Library, Brick Township Historical Society and Point Pleasant Historical Society.
